Status of coffee production in Africa

World production :171.3

Arabica: 96.6 (56%)

Robusta:73.7 (44%)

Africa:19.4 (ca 11.3% of the global production)




Fig.1 Global coffee production 2022



Status of coffee production in Africa (cont'd)




Fig.2 African coffee production in the last six years



Status of coffee production in Africa (cont'd) - Challenges

- Challenges of African coffee production
 - Price volatility ,
 - Climate changes issues (drought, pests and diseases out breaks)
 - Old coffee plantations
 - Lack of high yielding varieties and resistant to pests and diseases
 - Lack sufficient funds to invest in coffee
 - Lack of government enabling policies for supporting the sector in some countries



Introduction

- The DRD/ACRN main goal is to revitalize and improve research in order to enhance the productivity and quality of African coffee, with the key missions of:
 - Promoting cooperation and exchange of scientific information and technologies among members;
 - Encouraging common research objectives to address constraints of African coffee production
 - Establishing collaboration with national and international institutes and coffee research organizations;
 - Raising funds to support the African coffee research

- 4. Administrative support and representation of IACO


1. Development and Dissemination of Scientific and Technical Information and Reference Documents

- Research institutes from 21 ACRN member countries were contacted to request information on coffee researchers and centres to update data base at IACO/ACRN. 20 countries provided information and the updated list of researchers is available on ACRN website.
- Creation of the ACRN Website: www.iaco-oiac.org/ACRN
- Proceedings of the 5th African coffee Scientific conference posted on ACRN website
- IACO/ACRN is in collaboration with researchers in Jimma Agriculture Research Centre in Ethiopia and the Ethiopian Coffee Society in developing a manual for coffee disease management.
- Meetings with researchers organised to strengthen the collaboration

2. Development and follow up of research projects

I. Drafting research projects for submission to donors for funding:

- We received a grant of 279,265 Euro from GIZ under the project 'Facilitating the implementation of leaving prosperous income commitments in which we are collaborating with the Sustainable Food Lab (Development of IACO and ACRN websites, Support in promoting domestic coffee consumption, capacity building and facilitate collaboration with our members through the focal points)
- IACO in collaboration with CABI and ICO prepared a project proposal on Rapid appraisal of the financing landscape for the coffee sector in Africa' that was submitted to Afreximbank for funding. A grant of 52,640 USD was received and CABI was contracted to carry out the study which is now completed and the report is available



2. Development and follow up of research projects (cont'd)

 IACO coordinated the drafting of 2 proposals by researchers from Uganda, Kenya, Burundi, and Rwanda, which were submitted to International Centre of Insect Physiology and Ecology (ICIPE) and Bioresources Innovations Network for Eastern Africa Development Programme (BioInnovate Africa), following a call for proposal which was which was made

II. Follow up on the implementation of the project: 'Promoting Domestic Coffee Consumption in Africa' in IACO Anglophone member countries:

 A training on coffee roasting and cupping was organised in Ghana from the 4th to the 7th of October 2021. 21 participants from Ghana, Cameroon, and Liberia attended.

2. Development and follow up of research projects (cont'd)

The project has supported the establishment of coffee kiosks in different member countries. And the DRD was in charge of following in Ghana, Kenya (Egerton & Kenyatta Universities), Uganda (Kyambogo University), Rwanda (5 coffee boxes established by Stafford coffee company).



III. Visited the regional capping centers in Cote d'Ivoire, Cameroon, Uganda and Zambia.

➤ Apart from Zambia other centers are operational and under the respective coffee boards

2. Research projects (cont'd):



IACO/GIZ project: 'Facilitating the implementation of living prosperous income (LPI) in IACO member countries

Follow up on the living income benching in Angola, Ethiopia, Rwanda and Togo (study still ongoing in Ethiopia)

➤ The project is also supporting in promoting domestic coffee consumption in member countries by supporting in coffee equipment, and training

youth in barista.







3. Coordination and support to research centres in member countries

Strengthening collaboration/cooperation with partners

- Working with secretary General in discussing partnership with different organisations (MoU drafted and signed: AFCFTA, ARSO, Café continent)
- MoU between IACO and Café Continent for collaboration in establishing a coffee training center for youth in Barista was signed.
- MoU with IACO and the African Regional Standards Organisation (ARSO).
- Several meetings were held with our partners aimed at strengthening the collaboration and support in implementing IACO's vision. Some of the partners met include the CIRAD & ASIC secretary

 - Research should be oriented in a way to solve challenges faced by the coffee farmers
 - To strengthen the linkage between research and extension so as to facilitate the dissemination of research findings to farmers.

- DRD department participated actively in day-to-day activities of the IACO secretariat




- The source of income of the ACRN in the last two years has been the contribution of the member countries.
- Each member country pays an annual contribution of 2,000USD (1,525 Euro).
- The aim of this brief financial report is to update ACRN members on the financial status of the network, including the available amount in the bank, expenses made in 2021-2023, and the status of contributions from member countries.

- Non-paid contributions for 2022/2023 including arrears of previous years **290,281 Euros** equivalent to **190,411,854 CFA**
- ☐ The contributions for this coffee year alone (2023/2024) without arrears are 32,050 Euro and 40% of this amount is expected to be recovered
- ☐ In the meantime, ACRN pleads with members to do their best to clear their arrears for the benefit of strengthening the network.
